Special note: We urgently need two or three players born in 2002 or 2003 for the under 16s team, so please



Amateur boxing tournament

For the second time, the Boxam amateur championships will be held in Tenerife's capital, Santa Cruz, from September 30 to October 7.

Over 20 national teams are expected to take part, with commitments already in place from Spain, Germany, Belgium, Austria, Bulgaria, Scotland, Finland, France, England, Wales, Hungary, Israel, Italy,

Norway, Portugal, Russia, Turkey, Cape Verde, Switzerland, and the Dominican Republic. There over 10 weight categories for the men's division, while women will compete in the 51, 54, 60, 64 and 75 kilogram categories.

The international competition is for amateur boxers aged between 19 and 40 years. Large numbers of female fight-

ers have flocked to the sport in recent years, with several successful representatives based in Tenerife. María del Mar Rodríguez won the competition in 2008, and Patricia Hernández will be defending her title following her championship win last year.

Boxam was founded in Germany in 1976. Juan Manuel García, known in circles as 'Kid Puerto Cruz' was the tournament's most successful competitor, winning five medals until his retirement seven years ago.

Santa Cruz sports councillor, Verónica Meseguer, was delighted to announce that the capital city will host this year's Boxam amateur event – a tournament which will help to cement Santa Cruz de Tenerife in international boxing circles. Around 300 people are expected to take part in the competition, including boxers, coaches, medical staff, friends and family. ■
